I am delighted to share the first Global Engagement Report from the University of Bath International Relations Office. We are proud to have forged forward with our aspiration to become an internationally leading University despite the external challenges of a global pandemic and the UK's withdrawal from the European Union. The University, despite the turbulent year, has continued to perform well in the league tables, ranked 6th out of 121 universities in the UK in the Guardian University League Table, and we are delighted to have risen in the QS International rankings to 166th out of 1300 universities worldwide.

The Turing Scheme

The International Relations Office is delighted to confirm that we have been successfully awarded funding for 372 placements under the new UK Government Turing Scheme.

The scheme will support students on work and study placements in a number of international destinations. The Turing Scheme also enables us to provide funding to students who would not ordinarily have the opportunity to study or work due to financial constraints.

It is anticipated that the full scheme will be launched for 21/22 late September with a number of opportunities for students to engage.

They strive to further improve policies, national institutions and programmes, for the well-being of every child in Jordan, in line with Jordan's Vision 2025 and the National Human Resources Development Strategy (2016-2025) towards achieving the Sustainable Development Goals.

Agreement with the UN renewed

We are delighted to have signed a two year renewal of our agreement with the UN, which will now run until 2023.

Managed by Dr Elena Kidd, Senior Lecturer in the Department of PoLIS, this MoU has enabled the department to organise UN languages placements, including traineeships and internships in Geneva, Vienna and New York, for Bath students in the following programmes:

- MA Interpreting and Translating (MAIT)
- MA Translation and Professional Language Skills (TPLS)
- MA Translation with Business Interpreting (TPI)

Since being first signed in 2009, the MoU has enabled us to organise placements for students with UN languages on a regular basis in Geneva, Vienna and New York.
