Before you arrive

We have prepared a handy checklist to help you prepare before you arrive.

It includes a wealth of information including Doctoral Induction activities, our guide to Registering with the University, Accommodation, Information for International students and Support Services, through to How to set-up your email and devices, Making the most of your time at University, Study Areas, and other useful links.

If you haven't already then don't forget to accept your offer. If you have a conditional offer, please upload any documents you need to show you've met the conditions of your offer.

Once you've accepted your offer, you will receive an email in September, <u>inviting you to register</u>. This is crucial to ensure you can use university facilities, get into buildings around campus and start your studies.

We also encourage you to reach out to your supervisor and plan your first meeting for when you arrive.

When you arrive

As well as meeting your supervisor, you should engage with the <u>induction programme</u>. Induction is an essential step in getting your programme off to a good start. Please take some time now to familiarise yourself with your induction programme and the dates and times of the compulsory sessions and activities. You will be able to book onto sessions and access online activities, once you have completed registration.

Your Doctoral Programmes Administrator will be in touch soon to introduce themselves and give you the opportunity to ask any questions that you may have.

Your Doctoral College

The Doctoral College is an expert hub supporting and developing a community of high quality doctoral researchers. We provide:

- Help during the doctoral recruitment process including the allocation of funding, to help recruit quality students to undertake high impact research
- Expertise on the implementation of doctoral standards and advocate for all things doctoral within the university
- Support as you progress through your doctoral journey and navigate your formal milestones, regardless of circumstance and need, to ensure they complete in time
- A researcher development programme to help you thrive while doing your studies, and provide opportunities to enable you to flourish in the future

So far, your application will have been dealt with by our Recruitment Team but soon they will hand over to the relevant Programme Administrator for your programme. They will look after you for the duration of your doctorate. If you have an unconditional offer you will hear from them before your course start date.

Your Programme Administrator will help with any initial queries you may have. They then coordinate your progress and assessment arrangements, including any associated

paperwork, and signpost you to support when you need it throughout your time here. They will also be there at the end of your degree to receive your thesis once you are ready to submit it.

Doctoral Development

As a doctoral researcher at the University of Bath you will be encouraged to develop your skills and enhance your networks. Within the Doctoral College we help you to do this by providing free skills development training and hosting regular events throughout the year, including:

- Doctoral Festival of Ideas to celebrate and raise the profile of doctoral research across the University
- Annual Three Minute Thesis competition where students have to talk about their research in 3 minutes with only one slide
- Annual celebration event to reward and recognise efforts and excellence within our doctoral community

Social and Study Space

There is a range of social and study space reserved for doctoral researchers in the Doctoral College's building, 10 West, and in the library. This complements the space provided by your department, giving you flexibility in where you choose to work.

Advice and support

Once you register, you will have access to <u>support for your wellbeing and mental health</u>, including Student Services, the <u>Students' Union</u>, and our Doctoral Peer Support scheme.

In most programmes, you'll also be eligible for support from a <u>Peer Mentor</u> at the beginning of your studies. They'll give you informal advice about studying in Bath and share their experiences as a doctoral student

<u>Student Services</u> provides you with a wide range of support and guidance, including: wellbeing, counselling and mental health support, money management, disability advice and support, and international student advice.

<u>The Disability Service</u> provides support for you if you have disabilities and/or long term health conditions, which can include but are not limited to: specific learning difficulties (e.g. dyslexia), Autistic Spectrum conditions, mobility or sensory impairments, and mental health

conditions.

Languages and culture


