During his career as a civil servant Dr Handley Stevens gained extensive experience of international work, served as a Departmental Director of Finance and was Under Secretary for International Aviation at the Department of Transport between 1983 and 1987. He was a Visiting Research Associate at the European Institute of the London School of Economics.

Professor Anne Stevens and Dr Handley Stevens are the authors of several books on topics relating to various aspects of the management and administration of the European Commission.

DESCRIPTION OF THE COLLECTION

The material is presented in the order given in the contents list which preserves as far as possible its original arrangement. It covers the period from 1958 to 2012 focussing mainly on the 1990s and early 2000s.

Comprising documentary evidence and source materials in English, French and German, the collection relates primarily to research conducted in preparation for *Brussels Bureaucrats?: The Administration of*

the European Union jointly authored by Professor Anne Stevens and Dr Handley Stevens and published by Palgrave Macmillan in 2000. It provides a representative 'snapshot' of the internal workings of the European Union alongside useful insight into the approach and methods of academics engaged in European Studies.
