

## University of Bath: Scheme of Delegation

This Scheme of Delegation sets out the authority held by Council and the Vice Chancellor and President and that which has been delegated to Committees or individual Officers of the University to exercise on their behalf.

The principal source of authority is derived from the University's Charter and Statutes but also its Ordinances and Regulations and legal obligations which it is required to meet.

Council is the supreme governing body and carries unambiguous, collective responsibility for overseeing the University's activities and determining its mission and strategic direction. Council ensures compliance with the Charter, Statutes Ordinances and other provisions regulating the university and its framework of governance.

Council comprises 21 members. In addition to the Vice Chancellor it has 11 lay members (including a lay chair) 4 members elected by Senate plus the Chair of Academic Assembly, 2 members elected by professional staff and 2 student sabbatical officers. In reaching its decisions it will take advice from Officers and staff of the University and such external experts as it deems appropriate.

Senate is the supreme academic body of the University and is responsible to Council for all matters of academic governance. Subject to the provisions of Statutes and Ordinances and any powers reserved to Council, Senate has the power to take measures or actions to further the best interests of the University as a place of teaching, learning and research. It may also delegate such of its powers as it sees fit to individuals or committees as appropriate.

The Vice-Chancellor and President is the academic leader, Chief Officer and Accountable Officer of the University and, by virtue of this position, has the authority to take certain decisions on behalf of the University. With regard to academic matters, the Vice-Chancellor and President is the ex officio Chair of Senate. Under Senate Standing Orders they are also authorised to act on behalf of Senate during vacation and other times to deal with urgent business, subject to certain reporting and consultation requirements. With regard to financial matters, the Vice-Chancellor and President may authorise any recurrent expenditure from the University budget as approved by Council, as well as capital expenditure within agreed limits. Further details are specified in the schedule below.

An extract of the relevant sections of the Charter and Statutes, outlining the specific responsibilities granted Council, Senate and the Vice Chancellor and President, is attached in Appendix 2.

Matters where the Vice Chancellor and President is listed as the final authority, may be delegated at their absolute discretion without further recourse to Council and similarly can be withdrawn by him and reallocated elsewhere. However, it is expected that the Head of Strategic Governance will be notified of any such changes in a timely manner so that this document can be kept up to date and available on-line as a source of reference. reference document.

Under exceptional circumstances Council reserves the right to determine any matter which it has previously delegated under this Scheme. However, the rationale for this course of action must be formally noted at the next meeting of Council.

Where any decision taken in accordance with this Scheme is expected to have significant implications or is known to be sensitive, the Committee or Officer to whom the authority is delegated should consult appropriately before exercising their delegation. Any Officer or Committee to whom power to act has been delegated can decide that it is not appropriate to exercise their delegation on a specific occasion and can refer the decision back to the entity or person listed as the final authority for decision.

No scheme of delegations can cover every eventuality so if in any doubt, you are required to seek guidance from the Head of Strategic Governance (HOSG). Similarly if you believe any aspect of the current delegations is impeding the smooth and timely running of the institution, you should continue to operate within the stated delegations but immediately bring the matter to the attention of HOSG for further consideration.

This Scheme will be maintained on an ongoing basis by HOSG. Any amendments approved by Council will take immediate effect, as will changes made by the Vice Chancellor and President where they are the final authority. Additionally, the content of the Scheme will be formally reviewed annually by ARAC and periodically by finance with respect to finance specific elements.

## Exercising Delegated Authority

In exercising delegated authorities, your decisions should:

- Always be consistent with the University's [values, aims and objectives](#)
- Never exceed the level of authority granted to you and must be within the allocated and approved budget
- Relate only to your sphere of operation ie not require the commitment of other areas of the university without their prior consent and following consultation as appropriate with relevant parties at a scale proportionate to the impact of the decision.
- Be taken only after consideration of the relevant documentation and in line with University policies and procedures
- Be taken in advance of any commitment of expenditure
- Be recorded in line with the University records retention policy such that if required due process could be demonstrated.

By signing the delegated authority specimen signature form you are confirming that you have read the delegated authorities document and associated financial procedures policy.

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	<p>19.17 To confer the title of Professor Emeritus or Honorary Professor, Reader or Lecturer, or other such title.</p> <p>19.18 On what the Senate deems to be good reasons to recommend to the Council the names of persons who, in the opinion of the Senate, should be deprived of any Degrees, distinctions or titles, Diplomas or Certificates, conferred on or granted to them by the University either itself or jointly or in conjunction with other institutions, and from whom all privileges connected therewith should be withdrawn.</p> <p>19.19 To prescribe conditions under which persons should be admitted to the University and to any particular scheme of study or research therein; and to determine by Regulations or otherwise, the conditions under which Students shall be permitted to continue their studies in the University.</p> <p>19.20 To determine the conditions under which and the extent, if any, to which periods and courses of study and examinations passed at other Universities, places of learning and other institutions, may be regarded as equivalent to periods and courses of study and examinations in the University.</p> <p>19.21 To recommend or report to the Council on any financial implications of the academic policy of the University, provided that no recommendation or report be made to the Council without taking into consideration any views expressed by the Boards of Studies of the Schools concerned.</p> <p>19.22 To make recommendations to the Council to institute, combine or discontinue Schools, Departments, Institutes or other academic sections of the University.</p> <p>19.23 To review from time to time the conditions of service and remuneration of all members of the Academic Staff and to make recommendations thereon to the Council.</p> <p>19.24 To appoint internal and external examiners and to determine their conditions of appointment and service.</p> <p>19.25 To institute, subject to any conditions acceptable to the Senate that might be made by the founders, Fellowships, Studentships, Scholarships, Exhibitions, Bursaries, Prizes and other such grants, for the encouragement of study and research; and to determine the times, modes and conditions of competition therefor and to award the same.</p> <p>19.26 To formulate, modify or revise schemes for the organisation of Schools, Departments, Institutes, or other such academic sections of the University, and to review from time to time the working of such schemes.</p> <p>19.27 To enquire into the teaching, research, staffing and general work of any School, Department or academic section of the University, and if the Senate so wishes, to report and make recommendations thereon to the Council.</p> <p>19.28 To be responsible for the general administration of the University Library.</p> <p>19.29 To supervise the extra-mural work of the University.</p> <p>19.30 To prescribe the academic dress to be worn by the Officers and Members of the University, and the occasions on which it shall be worn; and to determine the form and conduct of all academic ceremonies.</p> <p>19.31 To regulate and superintend the discipline of the Students of the University.</p>
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		<p>19.32 Subject to the provisions of Section 27 of these Statutes to expel any Student where Senate considers this appropriate.</p> <p>19.33 To take such steps as it thinks fit to control organisations of the Students.</p> <p>19.34 Except as otherwise provided, to appoint representatives of the University on other bodies.</p> <p>19.35 To receive records and reports of the proceedings of Boards of Studies of Schools or Institutes and to give directions to and consider recommendations from such Boards.</p> <p>19.36 To review, amend, refer back to disallow any act of any Board, Committee or appointed body of any School, Department, Institute, or other such academic sections of the University.</p> <p>19.37 To establish Joint Committees of the Senate and representatives of the Students' Union and to prescribe the method of appointment of such representatives and the functions of such Committees.</p> <p>19.38 To report to the Council on any matters referred to the Senate by the Council.</p> <p>19.39 To discuss, declare an opinion and make recommendations to the Council on any matter of interest to the University.</p> <p>19.40 Generally to exercise all such functions as are or may be conferred on the Senate by the Charter, these Statutes or the Ordinances.</p> <p>19.41 In accordance with Article 21 of the Charter, to recommend to the Council that it make Statutes which may amend, add to or repeal the Statutes for the time being in force.</p> <p>19.42 Where a scheme of study provides for more than one academic award, to rescind any award that may have been made to a person who subsequently qualifies for a higher award within the same scheme of study.</p> <p>19.43 To consider, to adjudicate upon, and, if thought fit, uphold academic appeals by students relating to (a) progression from one part of the programme of studies to the next; or (b) the outcome of examinations or formal course assessments; or (c) dissatisfaction of a student with the level of attainment where there exists new and relevant information concerning matters which might have affected that student's performance.</p>

THE SENATE</p> <p>9.1 Election of Members of the Academic Assembly to serve on the Senate</p> <p>(a) The University Secretary shall give notice to the Chair of the Academic Assembly of the number of vacancies on the Senate when these are to be filled by election from the Academic Assembly. The Chair shall give notice to all members of the Academic Assembly that seconded nominations for election are to be submitted to the University Secretary not later than a specified date. Staff eligible to participate in the election are members of Academic Assembly on full-time or fractional contracts. Staff may suggest themselves for election but require both a separate proposer and seconder, all of whom must be eligible to vote.</p>

	<p>(b) After receipt of nominations the University Secretary shall provide to all members of Academic Assembly, who are on a full-time or fractional contract, voting instructions, the names of the candidates nominated and the latest date by which votes must be cast.</p> <p>(c) The votes shall be counted under the direction of the University Secretary. If there is a tie, this will be resolved by drawing lots.</p> <p>(d) In accordance with Section 18.1(b)(ii) of the Statutes, the number of Professors elected to serve on the Senate by the Academic Assembly shall not exceed three at any one time.</p> <p>(e) If one or more of the vacancies is for a member to serve for less than three years, then the person with the lowest number of votes among those elected shall serve for the shortest period.</p> <p>(f) Members of Senate elected by Academic Assembly who are subsequently promoted to a Professorship be required to resign their original elected membership of Senate. A casual vacancy may be filled by the candidate with next highest number of votes, if there has been an election in the previous six months.</p> <p><b>9.2 Appointment of Twelve Professors to serve on the Senate</b></p> <p>The following procedure shall be adopted to elect twelve Professors to serve on Senate under the provisions of Section 18.1(b)(i) of the Statutes:</p> <p>(a) An election shall be held once in each year.</p> <p>(b) The University Secretary shall, at the appropriate time, notify all the professors who are not members of Senate ex-officio that the said election is about to be conducted and how many vacancies there are. The Professors eligible to participate in elections are those with the title of Professor who are on full-time or fractional contracts.</p> <p>(c) Any professor so notified may, by the date prescribed by the University Secretary, withdraw from the list of candidates for that year.</p> <p>(d) If the number of candidates remaining after the prescribed date does not exceed the number of vacancies, the University Secretary shall declare those candidates elected.</p> <p>(e) If the number exceeds the number of vacancies, an election shall be conducted in the following manner:</p> <p>(i) Professors are elected for a term of three years and may be re-elected for a further three years, up to a maximum of six years.</p> <p>(ii) The University Secretary shall declare the number of vacancies which remain to be filled and shall then conduct an election among the remaining candidates.</p> <p>(iii) The University Secretary shall provide to all Professors eligible to vote voting instructions, the names of the Professors standing for election and the latest date by which votes must be cast. The votes shall be counted under the direction of the University Secretary.</p> <p>(iv) Each member may vote for as many candidates as there are vacancies. Each voter in the second ballot shall have as many votes as there are vacancies.</p> <p>(v) The candidates who have received the greatest number of votes in the second ballot shall be declared elected. Ties in the second ballot shall be resolved by drawing lots.</p> <p>(vi) In the event of a casual vacancy, the unsuccessful candidate who had the next highest number of votes in the second ballot is appointed, if there has been an election in the previous six months. If there is more than one unsuccessful candidate tied on the next highest number of votes, this will be resolved by drawing lots.</p> <p>9.3 Chair of the Programmes and Partnerships Approval Committee</p> <p>The Chair of the Programmes and Partnerships Approval Committee shall be an ex-officio member of Senate.</p> <p>9.4 Student Members of Senate</p> <p>The student members of Senate are the President, Education Officer and Postgraduate Officer of the SU and one other student elected by campus ballot.</p>
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
